## **STREET**

- \*Street Supervisor Rick Swiger indicated that gravel has been swept up on the square/across the tracks.
- \*Swiger reported he and Mayor Gardner removed downed limbs at the cemetery from recent wind storm.

# ZONING/MAYOR'S ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT

- \*Zoning Inspector DJ Meek reported that two permits are pending one for a carport and one for a shed.
- \*Discussed the changing of zoning regulations for garage locations (attached & detached). Mayor Gardner indicated that a meeting with the zoning board will take place in the near future to discuss the changes for approval.
- \*Discussed heavy well drilling trucks traveling on village streets. Meek indicated that the companies are obligated to repair any damages. If the well drilling progresses as expected, the village needs to monitor any streets that are being traveled on. Meek indicated that there also may be other monies available for such repairs if needed.

### **INCOME TAX ADMINISTRATOR**

\*Reviewed and approved the  $4^{th}$  QTR and year to date 2024 Municipal Income Tax Report. The  $4^{th}$  qtr 2024 total received was \$31,403.95. The year to date total for income tax received in 2024 was \$156,178.04. Up from year 2023 – which was \$149,357.59.

\*Tax Administrator Donna Meek distributed a yearly income tax report from the last fifteen years (since she has been employed as tax administrator). Her first year (2010) as the Tax Administrator – the total received in was \$53,216.66 for the entire year. Her fifteenth year (2024) was a total of \$156,178.04 received in. A grand total received in for municipal income tax - from year 2010 through year 2024 – is \$1,595,322.87.

#### FISCAL OFFICER

\*F.O. Lute indicated that the permanent appropriations for year 2025 will be ready for passage at the next regular council meeting to be held on Jan. 7, 2025 @ 7pm.

### **MAYOR**

\*Mayor Gardner requested that the Amendment Ordinance for the usage of "Engine/Jake Brakes be presented as an emergency passage. Section 1 is the only change from original Ordinance # 2003-11. (See passage for Ordinance # 2024-07).

\*Mayor Gardner presented council with his proposed 2025 committees. Gardner proposed that all committees remain the same from year 2024. Motion made by Brandie Bourne and seconded by Ed Steffek to leave all committees as is from year 2024. All council members present were in favor.

### JOE BOURNE

\*Bourne inquired to what monies will be available for street paving projects for 2025. Council and Fiscal Officer discussed and agreed for paving projects to be no more than the "no bidding" amount of \$75,000. Bourne will bring back to council-street paving projects for year 2025 in the near future for approval.

\*Bourne reported 46 children in attendance for meet and greet "Santa" at the Fire Station recently.

# **RESOLUTIONS & ORDINANCES**

Motion to suspend the rules made by Brandie Bourne and pass on an emergency basis

Resolution # 09-2024. Motion was seconded by Ed Steffek. Resolution

#09-2024 is the agreement for housing of prisoners at the Tuscarawas County Jail for a sum of
\$90 per day. Roll call taken and all council members present were in favor.

Motion made by Nate Penrod and seconded by Brandie Bourne to pass and enact Resolution

#09-2024 as stated. Roll call taken and all council members present were in favor.

Motion to suspend the rules made by Brandie Bourne and pass on an emergency basis Resolution # 11-2024. Motion was seconded by Ed Steffek. Resolution #11-2024 is for the 2025 temporary appropriations for expenditures. Temporary totals are as follows: General Fund \$524,297.05, Street Construction Fund \$23,025.43, State Highway Fund \$1,188.92, Cemetery Fund \$5.37, Permissive Motor Vehicle Fund \$ 8,708.44, Other Capital Projects \$3,012.63. Roll call taken and all council members present were in favor.

Motion made by Nate Penrod and seconded by Brandie Bourne to pass and enact Resolution #11-2024 as stated. Roll call taken and all council members present were in favor.

Motion to suspend the rules made by Brandie Bourne and pass on an emergency basis Ordinance 2024-07. Motion was seconded by Nate Penrod. Ordinance #2024-07 is for the amendment of section 1 from original ordinance 2003-11 for engine/jake brake usage in the village. Section 1 now reads as follows: (74.52 Use of Engine Brakes Prohibited) No Person shall utilize an engine brake in the operation of any motor vehicle over or upon the public streets, highways, bridges, or culverts in this municipality unless other parking devices on the vehicle have failed or exigent circumstances exist that require the use of such a brake system. Roll call taken and all council members present were in favor.

The previous ordinance did not allow for any engine/jake brake usage in an emergency situation.

Motion made by Ed Steffek and seconded by Steve Adams to pass and enact Ordinance #2024-07 as stated. Roll call taken and all council members present were in favor.
