PRIOR MEETING MINUTES

VISITORS

*Visitor/Resident Pat Herbert – Resident Pat Herbert addressed the council concerning the mowing violations, trash issues and bee problems within the village corporation. Herbert indicated that she has a neighbor who are raising bees; however; the bee hives are close to her property and causing issues. The village does not have any type of restrictions for bee hives. Mayor Gardner informed Herbert that the village police department has been working on clean up notices, junk vehicles and mowing violations. Gardner will work with the village police department on the continued effort in enforcing the village ordinances. Herbert stated that she feels that one notice for violations should be sufficient and then they should be cited into court if they don't comply; and that these are adults who should take pride in the community.

STREET

*Heard that Street Supervisor Rick Swiger completed the assembly of the stands/lights for the usage at the village square during power outages. *Swiger indicated that the street light at the square/Rt. 36 is hanging a little low. ODOT needs to be contacted in order to raise the sagging lights.

INCOME TAX ADMINISTRATOR

*Income Tax Administrator Donna Meek informed council that 3 village residents will be cited into court on violation of complying with the village income tax ordinance. A total of approximately \$11,000 is owed to the village for delinquent income tax remittance.

ZONING/ADMIN ASST.

- *Admin Assist. DJ Meek indicated that he and the mayor did a run through of the village for the sidewalk project which will be completed in the Spring of 2026. Many trees will be removed on Main Street. All residents that will be affected by the project were contacted.
- *Heard that Mayor Gardner signed off for a \$14,000 payment to Thrasher Engineering Co. for design fees.

MAYOR

- *Mayor Gardner informed council that the cemetery- board has agreed to purchase a new mower for the cemetery. No cost to the village for the purchase.
- *Mayor Gardner presented and read the 3rd and final reading of Ordinance #2025-4 for passage (prohibiting the keeping of certain animals). No new information was brought to the table. See passage under the Resolutions & Ordinances section.

JOE BOURNE

*Bourne stated that a small hole has formed in the back of the Historical Society Bldg. after the paving was recently completed. Bourne indicated that this has happened in the past and the village will fill the hole with sand and grit for a temporary patch to see if anything else develops.

NATE PENROD

*Penrod stated that there are a number of trees within the village that needs trimmed back from the alleys and streets. Street Supervisor Swiger will take a few days and handle the trimming as needed.

BRANDIE BOURNE

*Bourne requested that the village pay \$20 for Patrolman Tom Casimir to complete a CPR class. **Motion made by Brandie Bourne and seconded by Joe Bourne to** approve the payment of \$20 for the CPR class as requested. Roll call taken and all council members present were in favor.
